

PURPOSE

Create a complete inventory of the dream evidence using concrete language, sequence, and outcome.

1 Setting

Name every location, time cue, boundary, direction, distance, weather condition, and environmental change.

2 People and roles

List every person, group, relationship, role, age cue, posture, expression, arrival, and departure.

3 Actions and objects

Record who acted, what changed, what remained still, what was carried, given, opened, closed, lost, or restored.

4 Movement and outcome

Trace the order, identify the turning point, and give the final scene special attention.

WORKING QUESTIONS

- Which sentence reports only what appeared?
- Which phrase already assigns meaning and belongs in a later layer?
- What repeated, intensified, diminished, reversed, or remained unresolved?
- What changed immediately before the outcome?
- Which detail would be easy to overlook because another image felt more dramatic?

DEEPENING QUESTION

Does my observation map contain concrete nouns, verbs, qualities, sequence, and outcome while preserving meaning for the interpretation layer?

Observation creates the evidentiary ground. Strong interpretation begins with patient attention to the complete dream.
