

Synthesize the Whole Dream

Let the complete movement govern the meaning of every part.



PURPOSE

Develop one coherent central message that accounts for the opening state, tension, turning point, response, and outcome.

1 State the opening condition

Describe the initial setting, need, tension, question, or relationship in one evidence-based sentence.

2 Find the hinge

Identify the moment after which the direction, atmosphere, relationship, access, or outcome changes.

3 Give the ending authority

Ask how the final scene confirms, revises, limits, or reinterprets earlier details.

4 Write and challenge the message

Draft one central message, then build the strongest plausible alternative and compare both with the whole evidence field.

WORKING QUESTIONS

- What movement connects the first scene to the last?
- Which major elements must the central message explain?
- What changed at the hinge, and who initiated the change?
- Which interpretation requires fewer unsupported assumptions?
- What remains unresolved after synthesis?
