

Test Through Seven Witnesses

Strengthen, narrow, postpone, revise, or release each claim.

PURPOSE

Evaluate a proposed interpretation through converging evidence while calibrating theme, timing, identity, and application separately.

1 Whole dream and outcome

Require the leading claim to account for major elements, movement, atmosphere, turning point, and final scene.

2 Scripture and God's character

Record the passage's actual teaching, thematic resonance, limits, and consistency with God's revealed character.

3 Facts and counsel

Verify circumstances, permissions, obligations, risks, and relevant wisdom from mature, accountable people.

4 Prayer, peace, and fruit

Invite Holy Spirit illumination and correction. Observe restraint, character, relational effects, and mature fruit over time.

- 3. God's character and the fruit of the Spirit
- 4. Verified facts, circumstances, and permissions
- 5. Wise, mature, and accountable counsel
